


Leader's SPEAK

"If you don't give up, you still have a chance. Giving up is the greatest failure."

Jack Ma's life story is a testimony to how failures are the stepping stones in your path to success. Success never comes easy, it comes with a lot of hard work, dedication and perseverance.

Jack Ma - born Ma Yun - was born on October 15, 1964, in Hangzhou, located in the south-eastern part of China. He and his siblings grew up at a time when communist China was increasingly isolated from the West, and his family didn't have much money when they were young.



Without money or connections, the only way Ma could have gotten ahead was through education. After high school, he applied to go to college but failed the entrance exam twice. After a great deal of studying, he finally passed in the third attempt and went on to graduate from the Hangzhou Teachers College in 1988. He started applying to as many jobs as he could.

He received more than a dozen rejections - including from brands like KFC and prestigious intstitutes like Harvard Business School. His first two business ventures failed. Four years later, he gathered 17 of his friends in his apartment and convinced them to invest in his vision for an online marketplace called Alibaba. The site allowed exporters to post product listings that customers could buy directly.

Soon, the service started to attract members from all over the world. By October 1999, the company had raised \$5 million from Goldman Sachs and \$20 million from SoftBank, a Japanese telecom company that also invests in technology companies. Today, Jack Ma's net worth is \$38.4 billion.

His life story not only inspires us but teaches us the importance of having strong determination, persistence and positive outlook towards life.

According to Gartner market researchers, Intelligent Digital Mesh - the intelligent networking of devices, content & services - will shape the technological world in 2019

- Autonomous Devices: Autonomous devices use artificial intelligence to improve interaction with their environment and humans. In the future, Gartner expects more and more autonomous devices to network and collaborate either independently or with minimum human input.
- Augmented Analytics: This trend represents another stride for big data, by combining it with Artificial Intelligence (AI). Use of Machine Learning (ML) will transform the development, sharing, and consumption of data analysis. It is anticipated that the capabilities of augmented analytics will soon be commonly adopted not only to work with data, but also to implement in-house business applications related to human resources, finance, sales, marketing and customer support all with the aim to optimize decisions by using deep data analysis.
- Digital Twins: A digital twin is a virtual replica of a real-world system or entity. It is estimated that by 2020, there will be more than 20 billion sensors connected to end points. Initially, organizations will implement these replicas, which will continue to be developed over time, improving their ability to compile and visualize the right data, make improvements, and respond effectively to business objectives.
- Immersive experience: Virtual Reality (VR), Augmented Reality (AR) and Mixed Reality (MR) are changing the way people perceive the digital world. This combined shift in models of perception and interaction leads to users immersing themselves in the virtual world in a completely different way.

Culture Bytes: CHINA

In this issue of 'Culture Bytes', we are going to tell you about the rich history and culture, business etiquettes and top 5 places of visit in the beautiful and mysterious land of China.

Since ancient times, China has been known as the 'Celestial Empire'. This refers not only to China's strength and position as East Asia's Middle Kingdom, it also captures a more profound meaning, describing a land where divine and mortal once co-existed. It refers to the belief that the divine, through various dynasties, transmitted a rich and abundant culture to the Chinese people. Chinese culture is thus known as "divinely inspired", and is the only culture in the world to have a continuous recorded history of 5,000 years.


When it comes to business, Chinese are professional, meticulous and polite. Developing insights into the Chinese business culture and social etiquette will help you to avoid miscommunication and potential misunderstandings.

- **Greetings:** In China, nodding and smiling are very common greetings. In official business meetings, you will be offered a handshake. This handshake must be initiated by your Chinese counterpart.
- Addressing: It is very common for Chinese to address people by their titles followed by their surnames, for instance Manager Wang or Prof. Zhang. If you are unsure about the titles, you can also use Sir, Ma'am, Mr. and Ms.
- **Business cards:** Exchanging business cards is another key part of introductions. A business card is regarded as an extension of the person, so treat the business card carefully. The polite thing to do is accept the business card with both hands and look at it carefully as you do so.
- Small talk: Chinese people, much like English-speaking people around the world, often open conversations with small talk. Ask questions such as "How are you?" or "How have you been?" to break the ice at professional settings.

Conversation topics: While striking conversations with Chinese people, it is wise to stick to topics such as weather, travel, scenery, or food. These are safe topics to initiate the conversation. However, topics such as politics, especially those related to Taiwan and Tibet, must be avoided completely.

TOP 5 PLACES TO VISIT IN CHINA:

China as a tourist destination offers limitless scope for exploration. The natural beauty with picturesque landscapes and mountains, tranquillity of ancient temples and bustling cities such as Beijing - offer incredible experiences to satisfy the adrenaline rush of any travel junkie.



The Forbidden City, Beijing: China's largest and most important building, the Forbidden City - also known as the Imperial Palace - is situated in the very heart of Beijing and is a must-see while visiting the country.

Emperor Qinshihuang's Mausoleum Site Museum: It's one of China's most important tourist destinations and offers the unforgettable experience of standing in front of this assembly of soldiers and horses as if inspecting a century-old parade.

The Summer Palace: The Summer Palace, situated in the northwest of Beijing, is said to be the best preserved imperial garden in the world, and the largest of its kind still in existence in China. It is only a short drive (15 km) from central Beijing, but seems like another world.
