Kalpana Chawla

Early Life

Kalpana Chawla was born on 17th March 1962, in Karnal (present-day Haryana). As a child, she was fascinated with airplanes and flying. She went to local flying clubs and watched airplanes flying with her father. After getting a Bachelor of Engineering degree in Aeronautical Engineering from Punjab Engineering College, India, she moved to the United States in 1982 and obtained a Master of Science degree in Aerospace Engineering from the University of Texas at Arlington in 1984. She went on to earn a second Masters in 1986 and a PhD in aerospace engineering in 1988 from the University of Colorado Boulder.

NASA Career

Kalpana Chawla joined the NASA Astronaut Corps in March 1995 and was selected for her first flight in 1996. Her first space mission began on

19th November 1997 as part of the six-astronaut crew that flew the Space Shuttle Columbia flight STS-87.

The mission was successfully completed. After the mission, Kalpana was assigned to technical positions in the astronaut office to work on the space station. During this, her performance was recognized with a special award from her peers.

In 2000, she was selected for her second flight as part of the crew of STS-107. On 16th January 2003, Kalpana finally returned to space aboard Space Shuttle Columbia on the ill-fated STS-107 mission. Her responsibilities included the microgravity experiments, for which the crew conducted nearly 80 experiments studying earth and space science, advanced technology development, and astronaut health and safety.





Demise

The world lost Kalpana Chawla in the Space Shuttle Columbia disaster which occurred on 1st February 2003. The Space Shuttle got disintegrated over Texas during re-entry into the Earth's atmosphere, with the loss of all seven crew members, shortly before it was scheduled to conclude its 28th mission, STS-107.

Remembering her legacy

Kalpana Chawla has lived a fulfilled life. She was a dreamer,

who lived life on her own terms and did what she loved doing.

Here are some interesting facts about this strong-willed astronaut:

She chose her own name

Apparently, her parents never gave her a formal name but nicknamed her 'Montu'. She picked her formal name at the age of three. She was brought to a nursery by her aunt. When the principal asked her name, her aunt replied,

"We have three names in our mind - Kalpana, Jyotsna, and Sunaina but haven't finalized anything." Then, the principal asked her what she would like to be called - she chose Kalpana.

She had varied interests

Apart from being a topper in academics, Kalpana had embraced her other hobbies as well such as poetry, dancing, cycling, and running.

Her love for flying led to a career in Space

Kalpana was a certified commercial pilot with a license to fly seaplanes and multi-engine airplanes. She also became a certified Flight instructor.

Few things named after Kalpana Chawla:

- The 74th Street in Jackson Heights, Queens in New York City was renamed to 'Kalpana Chawla Street'
- In her honour, the Haryana government set up a medical college and hospital in Karnal worth Rs.650 crore
- An asteroid that circles between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter is known as 51826 Kalpanachawla

There's a hill on Mars in her name

 India's 1st weather satellite is known as KALPANA-1

A NASA Supercomputer is named after her

 A planetarium in Kurukshetra, near Karnal, is named after her

Kalpana Chawla is a role model to not only women around the globe but also all the other people who dream of becoming astronauts. Based on her sheer hard work and determination, she has carved a name for herself in history. She is a pride of India and remains an inspiration to fellow Indian women.

Your most memorable moment at Clover Infotech?


